A successful conference at Cowlitz Regional Conference Center, high renewal rates and 45 new members, keeps us in a healthy financial condition.

Our new 501(C)3 status saved us several hundred dollars in sales tax, which we are no longer required to pay in WA state, as well as discounts given to non-profits. Since we received our new status, we have received 3 significant donations for which we were able to give tax deductible credits to the donors. 

# Blacksmith Folders by Gene Chapman











Two steel handle pocket knives bought or traded at The Oregon Knife Collectors Association (OKCA) show years ago. The top one was made by Russell and has a unique forged handle/spring. It looks similar to the Cicero Beckham patent # 118675. I had the Russell knife at the Stevenson Fall 2008 conference for show and tell. I think the Russell handle/spring was made with progressive dies under a hammer or press.

The Allen Patent # 123,138 spring and handle is also one piece of stamped steel. It has a sliding rivet on one side in a elongated hole which allows the handle to act as the blade spring.










I made these about a hundred years ago and keep them in my "Collect Your Own Work" drawer. The top one has a forged one piece handle made from 1/8 X 1/2 mild steel. The small scroll tang is bent slightly to keep the blade from passing through the handle, and a bronze stop pin for safety.

# **Interesting Patents**







You computer folks, Google has a patent search feature that is super, give it a try. Old patent drawings are a great source clip art and they are in the public domain, and **FREE!** 



"One Hour Folder" has two pieces of 1/4" round mild steel forge welded together and tapered for the handle spring. Thats my 50 year old Zippo from my Navy smoking days with many of the Countys and ports visited engraved on it. Sea store cigs sold for 10 cents a pack aboard ship. You couldn't afford not to smoke! I gave up cigs in 1968, cold turkey.

I made several of these folders, got fairly fast at it and could forge a spring and a rough shaped blade, forged and filed in about a hour. Perhaps a year later at a NWBA conference at Ike Bays farm, (remember the olden days of potluck and roasted pig on a spit) I got froggy and volunteered to demo the "One Hour Folder", yikes what a disaster, I hadn't practiced before hand and it was real bad. Leason learned, always practice before a demo or workshop.


